Genre: Action/Sci-fi

Run Time: 145 Minutes

Rating: Rated PG-13 for violence, brief language, some sexuality and drug content

Plot: In a futuristic world, the police have developed a method of protecting crime and arresting criminals before they commit the crime. Crime is disappearing, but there's one major ethical dilemma: What does it mean to punish people who haven't done anything wrong? What if you were wrong? And would you still trust the system if you suddenly discovered that you were guilty of a crime you had yet to commit?

Discussion Starters:

- Do you think people should be arrested if someone knows they will inevitably commit a crime in the future? Explain.
- If God plans the course of our lives, how can we be held responsible for the things we do?
- Would you rather be free from fear of crime or be free to do what you want?
- Read Galatians 5:13-14. According to this passage, what should we do with our freedom? How risky was it for God to give us such freedom?
